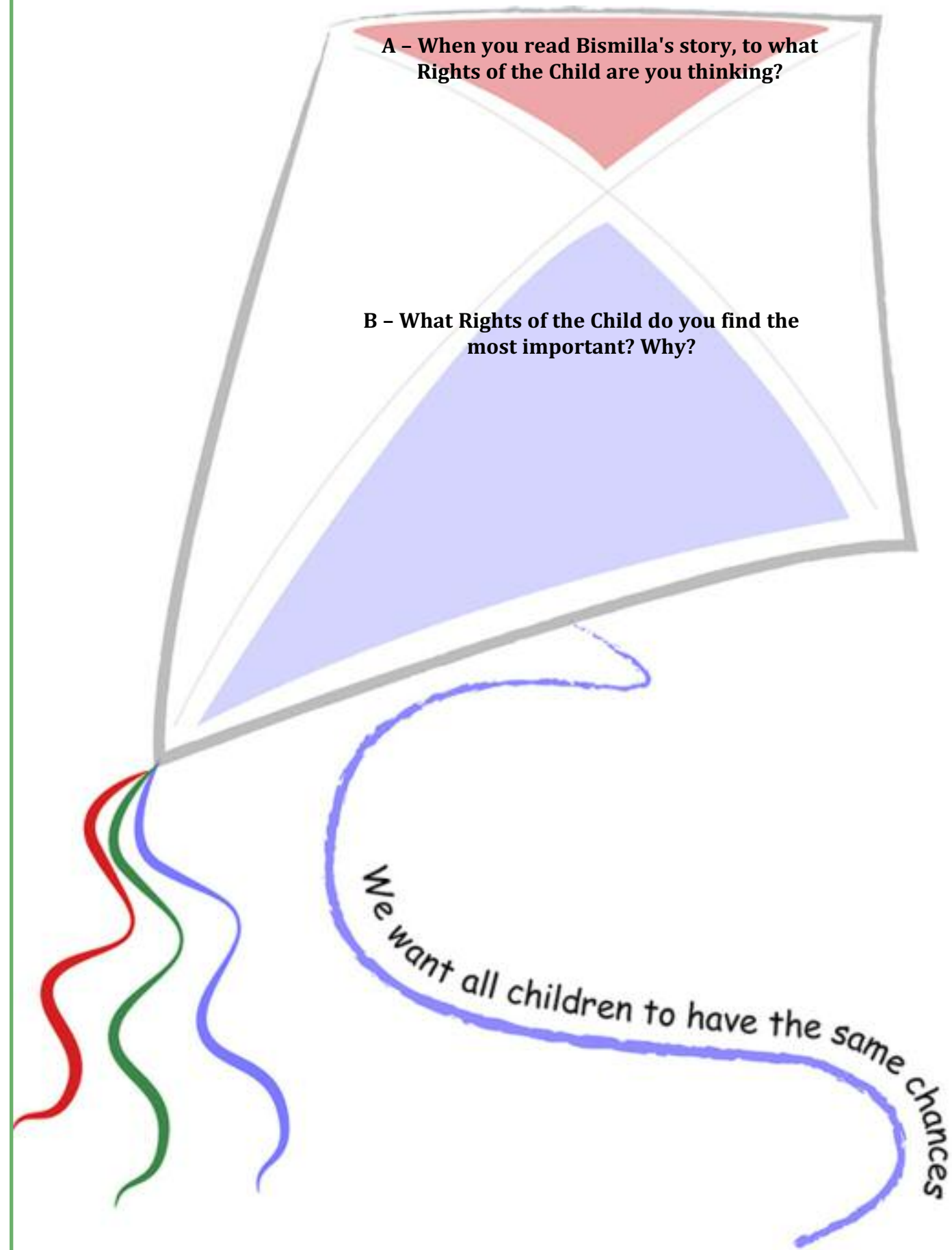


Activite B : The kite of friendship.

There are many children throughout the world who, like Bismilla, have to leave their country. Their family flee because of war, hunger and poverty. They can be welcomed in other countries when the countries agree to give them protection and to help them settle down.

Every child has the right to live with his parents and to join them if they left the country.

Family

The country should respect the parents and extended family's right to raise their children.

Every family can practice their own religion.



Justice

If children appear before a judge, they have the right to be defended.



Every child has the right to live, be taken care of when he is sick.

Parents should receive the support and protection needed to help their children live well.

Live

Children should be protected from violence and hard work.

The country should preserve the child and his family from any form of exploitation.

Every child has the right to a name and nationality.

Every child should be treated equally.



Peace

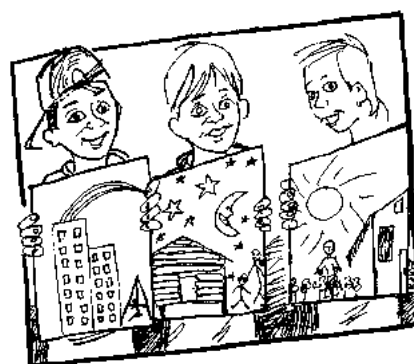
We cannot send children to war.



Every child has the right to attend school and to learn what is important to live well.

Education

Each child has the right to have time to play and to take part in activities. It's important in order to grow up well.



Express Oneself

All children have the right to talk freely and share their ideas.
