Equal justice for all

- Participation in the <u>Bonn climate</u> <u>conference</u> in collaboration with its partner networks. This includes meetings with numerous delegations and associations, and advocating when necessary to make its case. In particular, ATD insists on the need for funds for adaptation, mitigation, transition, and loss and damage to be directed in each country as a priority towards those in poverty. It stresses the need for solutions for those in poverty to be considered, implemented, and evaluated with their participation, and with them in mind.
- Publication of ATD Fourth World's report on social and environmental justice in French. This report is based on the lived experiences of people in poverty or those who have experienced it. It includes an analysis of <u>The Hidden</u> <u>Dimensions of Poverty</u> and presents official documents and commitments made by the international community on this issue. The report highlights advocacy efforts conducted by ATD Fourth World members since the Paris Climate Agreement within the framework of international negotiations. It provides recommendations for development actors, both public and private, to engage in suitable and impactful approaches.
