

ACTIVITIES



Individual activities:

1. ¿What do you like in this story?
2. What is your dream? Why?

Group activities: Make a collective "Wishing Tree".

Materials:

a large piece of cardboard, scissors, glue, felt pens or colouring pencils, and coloured paper.

Steps:

1. Cut the cardboard in the shape of a big tree (trunk and branches).
2. Each child writes their wish or dream on a small paper leaf or sticky note.
3. Attach all the leaves to the tree.
4. Display the children's work.
